



The Pan Am/Parapan Am Games are done! What happens now? Converting from Athletes' Village to the Canary District

On September 30, TO2015 will hand the Village site back to Infrastructure Ontario and the developer, Dundee Kilmer, to complete the project as planned – converting the buildings and roads to their permanent state as part of the new Canary District neighbourhood. Completion is scheduled for spring 2016.

During the conversion phase, access to the Village, including Mill Street and Front Street east of Cherry Street, will remain closed to ensure the safety of the general public and the workers on site. The continued closure of Mill Street and Front Street will allow remaining roadwork to take place. It will also allow the unrestricted movement of materials and construction vehicles around the site in order to meet the completion schedule. The construction site boundary is labeled in green on the attached map.

Conversion – What's being done?

- Cherry Street and Old Eastern Avenue will re-open on September 30, improving pedestrian and vehicle access around the site.
 - The northbound lane of Cherry Street from Lake Shore Blvd to Mill Street will be closed in the near future for 4-6 weeks for water main work being done by Waterfront Toronto. Dates for this work are not yet known, but Waterfront Toronto will ensure they are communicated.
- New interior roads Mill Street and Front Street east of Cherry Street will remain closed for the final stretch of the project, which includes completion of the Cherry Street TTC extension and the installation of traffic signals at intersections.
- Completion of residential buildings and the YMCA.

Occupancy of the market condos and all other buildings will take place in spring/summer 2016.
