Lakeland Consulting Inc. ("Lakeland" or "Fairness Monitor" or "we") has been engaged by Infrastructure Ontario ("IO") as Fairness Monitors, monitoring the Sponsors' conduct during the procurement process for this project to ensure that an open and transparent procurement process is followed.

As part of this mandate, the Fairness Monitor sought to ascertain that Proponents are treated fairly, and that the process remained confidential and free from conflict of interest whilst ensuring that the evaluation criteria and procedures were consistently applied in a fair, and objective manner.

The Project which will replace two older facilities (Thunder Bay District Jail and the Thunder Bay Correctional Centre) which is being undertaken by IO in collaboration with the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services ("MCSCS").
